Chancellor's Letter

December 2024

Dear students, alumni, colleagues, faculty, and staff,

The past year has been nothing short of transformational for University of Arkansas Grantham, as we successfully reached key milestones in our years-long journey of integration into the University of Arkansas System.

Throughout this journey, which began in mid-2021, every part of the organization has been overhauled, streamlined, and made more effective: Curricula have been rewritten, outdated technology replaced, regulatory approvals secured at all levels, and teams and facilities consolidated for greater efficiency.

All the while, we never lost sight of our north star, our mission: "To provide quality, accessible, affordable, professionally relevant programs in a continuously changing global society".

As I write this, we expect that more than 3,700 students will have been enrolled and become active in their UA Grantham classes in 2024. This, impressive as it may sound, is but the culmination of our work receiving and responding to nearly 90,000 inquiries from prospective students and supporting thousands of applications.

And so, we have no doubt as to the validity of our mission, the need for our work, the urgency with which we must meet it, and the overall prospects for our university.

This Annual Report serves several purposes: first, it provides a high-level introduction to the university: our work, our teams, and – most importantly – those whom we serve; second, it presents the accomplishments of the past year in the broader context of joining the UA System; lastly, it serves as a template for future annual reports.

There is a lot of information in these pages, but what we are most honored to be part of are the stories of our graduates: coming from all walks of life and overcoming adversity with grit and determination, told in their own words.

Our graduates' stories are testament to the promise of education as a transformational force for good. I hope you will find their testimonials as moving, inspiring, and motivating as we do.

University Timeline

- 1951 The **Grantham Radio License School** is founded by WWII veteran Donald Grantham to serve US service members; the name is later changed to **Grantham School of Electronics**
- 1955 The school opens sites in Washington, D.C., and Los Angeles, CA
- 1961 The school receives accreditation from the Distance Education and Training Council, today's Distance Education Accrediting Commission (DEAC)
- 1968 The institution is named Grantham College of Engineering
- 1971 The college moves to Falls Church, Virginia; begins awarding its first associate degrees
- 1976 The college focuses on distance education; closes residential operations
- 1977 The college is the only school in the US offering an accredited Bachelor of Science in Electronics through distance education
- 1990 The college receives approval to operate in and relocates to Louisiana
- 2002 The college becomes **Grantham University**
- **2005** The university relocates to Kansas City, Missouri after Hurricane Katrina destroys all but one building on the Slidell, Louisiana, campus
- 2014 The university relocates to Lenexa, Kansas
- 2016 The university receives programmatic accreditation from ABET for its Bachelor of Science in Electronics Engineering Technology program
- 2020 During the pandemic shutdown, a virtual commencement ceremony is held to honor the Class of 2020
- 2021 The university becomes a remote workplace
- Nov. 1, 2021 The university joins the University of Arkansas System and becomes University of Arkansas Grantham

Joining the University of Arkansas System

In 2021, the University of Arkansas System acquired Grantham University from its corporate owner for \$1.00. This transaction was a first of its kind: the first time a proprietary institution joined a public university system without any further ongoing contractual obligations between the two parties.

Over the next three years, the University of Arkansas System and the newly named University of Arkansas Grantham worked diligently to meet every regulatory requirement and check every box in a long list of necessary actions.

Far from being a foregone conclusion, gaining approvals required a sustained effort focused on gaining the trust of key bodies and decision makers.

In addition to the external work, teams across the university collaborated on an ambitious internal overhaul that completely remade the university; the following timeline represent this external and internal work.

2021

- July University of Arkansas System announces plan to acquire Grantham University
- **August** Arkansas Division of Higher Education (ADHE) notified of the acquisition and votes to recognize the university as a member of the UA System and a public, not-for-profit university
- **September** Change of Ownership Application, Part 1 submitted to Distance Education Accrediting Commission (DEAC); the US Department of Education is informed of the transaction
- October Kansas Board of Regents (KBOR) is notified of and approves the transaction
- October November Programmatic accrediting bodies ABET, CCNE, ACEN, and IACBE notified
- **November 1** The university becomes University of Arkansas Grantham and joins the University of Arkansas System; headquarters is relocated to Little Rock, Arkansas; an administrative location is maintained in Lenexa, Kansas
- December The Department of Education issues a Temporary Provisional Program Participation Agreement

2022

- · January UA System's eVersity staff are integrated into UA Grantham
- March Change of Ownership Application, Part 2 submitted to DEAC
- April UA System's eVersity students wishing to continue studies transfer to UA Grantham
- July DEAC issues final approval of the Change in Ownership, Name, and Location; new website unveiled

2023

- March The Student Information System and university-wide business processes are migrated to a new system; a new student portal is introduced
- June The US Department of Education approves the Change in Ownership and confirms public status
- **July** The university's Customer Resource Management (CRM) and marketing automation system is migrated to a more cost-efficient platform
- **August** All undergraduate programs 27 in total are revised to align to the general education requirements of the Arkansas Division of Higher Education (ADHE)

2024

- January All faculty and staff are onboarded into official State of Arkansas positions
- **April** National Council for State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements (NC-SARA) recognizes UA Grantham as an Arkansas institution
- May Arkansas State Approving Agency for Veterans Training approves the transition from Kansas to Arkansas
- August The Lenexa, KS, administrative location is closed; operations consolidated in Little Rock
- **September** The university renews the Department of Defense (DOD) Memorandum of Understanding and completes the transition to UA Grantham with the DOD

It has not been an easy road by any means ... I am a late grad. I started on my twoyear degree right out of high school but burned myself out quickly working full time... At 18, it's so hard to decide what path to pursue. I wound up taking about a year and a half off ... and then found University of Arkansas eVersity. Since 2019, I have been working full time and taking as many classes as possible. ... I received my associate degree, and then took about 10 months off to focus on work and raising our daughter. I began again in 2022 with UA Grantham to finish my bachelor's ... It may have taken a bit longer than I planned, but I am completing perhaps one of the most important goals I will ever set in my whole life.

Strategic Priorities

UA Grantham has established three key strategic priorities to drive its mission of supporting students in reaching their educational and professional development goals.

- **Student Success** Focuses on fostering student persistence and ultimately supporting students from enrollment to graduation. This commitment ensures that students not only start but also complete their academic journeys, paving the way for long-term achievements.
- **Student Experience** Encompasses the quality and consistency of the university's "product" from that first interaction with an Admissions team member to the continuing engagement of students with the core educational offerings, our work aims to provide a seamless, supportive, and enriching experience.
- **University Excellence** Underscores a dedication to operational excellence, emphasizing continuous improvement in all facets of university operations, and supporting the overarching goal of strengthening UA Grantham as a thriving, self-sustaining institution.

By aligning activities to these three priorities, the university aims to create an environment that supports students and upholds a high standard of service, education, and institutional effectiveness. Key achievements in support of these priorities include:

- Transition to Open Education Resources (OER) Replacing costly textbooks with free and up-to-date content to support program relevancy. So far, 60% of 420 courses have been transitioned to OER this year.
- **Better new student onboarding** UA Grantham Engage, the new student orientation course, has been enhanced and streamlined; the course won the Anthology Exemplary Course Program Award for 2024.
- Improved first-term experience A new pilot program focused on improving and increasing the frequency of instructor-student interaction. Student success rate in courses that are part of the pilot improved 20%.
- Consolidation of operations in Little Rock This year we successfully closed the administrative location in Lenexa, Kansas, and consolidated all university operations in Little Rock. Estimated annual savings are nearly \$1.2 million.
- Prospective student nurture and student communications This year we expanded use of Element451, our CRM system, and converted all nurture communications from manual to automated processes.

- **Student Information System** This year we continued to expand usage of Anthology Student, our new Student Information System. Notably, new workflows enabled transition from manual to automated processing of student status changes for applicants and students.
- UA System collaboration This year we continued to work with community colleges that are part of the UA System on pathways for their graduates to enroll in UA Grantham programs. To date, two agreements have been signed, one is close to signing, and three are in advanced development.
- **Technology** Significant milestones in our multi-year journey to the cloud included retiring the old telephony system (savings: \$700k annually) and closing the second of three data centers (savings: \$140k annually).
- **Human Resources** Completed the build of a full-service HR organization supporting hiring, benefits, and payroll for a remote workforce distributed across 44 states.
- **Student support** This year, students and Student Advisors were matched based on the month on which students started, which aligned Advisors' workload with students' progress through the academic term.


Journey to Sustainability

The only institution in the University of Arkansas System not reliant on state funding, UA Grantham is focused on sustainability. But while the bottom line remains critical, becoming a not-for-profit, public institution presented an opportunity to redirect university activities.

As part of this realignment, we have gone through many changes. Over the past three years, our workforce has been reduced by half, mostly through voluntary attrition. Operating expenses and budgets have been reduced by many millions of dollars. For example, marketing expenses, which amounted to nearly a quarter of the university's budget (as is typical for a for-profit, online university) have been reduced by 75%.

UA Grantham is a smaller university than it was even three years ago. The total number of active students at any point in time has decreased from ~4,000 to ~2,600, and the number of students we graduate every year has also decreased significantly. Yet we expect to add nearly 1,000 new graduates to our alumni roll in 2024.

Today's UA Grantham is a more "organic" university, focused on retention rather than top-line growth. In June, enrollments have largely stabilized at a new equilibrium, thanks to the maturation of enrollment processes and retention systems developed over the prior two years. The university, thus, is well-positioned for stability in the coming year.

Expect More. Achieve More

At UA Grantham we fulfill our brand promise of "Expect More. Achieve More" every day. Over the years we have pulled together a wide range of benefits and services focused on student success, while doing the utmost to limit tuition increases, despite rising costs.

In 2021 we began providing Lenovo laptops at no cost to every new student enrolling in a degree program. We make a modern laptop accessible for our students because we know they need it, and that it will enhance their learning experience. Nearly 10,000 laptops have been shipped so far as part of this initiative. About 70% of newly enrolled students proceed to order a laptop as part of this program, and we are observing a 20-point higher persistence rate among these students.

But we're about so much more than technology. At the heart of our work is a caring team of experienced Student Advisors who personally support students every step of the way. From orientation to graduation, and through every kind of challenge imaginable – from class assignments to life events – UA Grantham Student Advisors help students as much as humanly possible.

And we make college-level learning even more possible by providing 24/7 access to online learning centers, databases and resources, live tutoring, and career services.

Impact in Arkansas

Since joining the University of Arkansas System in of 2021, UA Grantham has become an attractive option for adult learners in Arkansas who appreciate the convenience and flexibility of online learning.

For context, in 2020 and 2021, the two years prior to joining the University of Arkansas System, 70 university graduates were from Arkansas.

By 2023 – the last year for which we have full 12 months of data – Arkansas became the state from which we graduated the second highest number of students. In 2024, through early December, Arkansas overtook Texas to become the state from which the university graduates the highest number of students.

- In 2023 the university graduated **143** students from Arkansas, across all degree levels
- In 2024 the university conferred **152** degrees to Arkansas residents; Arkansas ranks first in bachelor degrees conferred during this period.

Arkansas Course Transfer System (ACTS)

UA Grantham participates in the Arkansas Course Transfer System, the post-secondary education resource service coordinated by the Arkansas Department of Higher Education. ACTS provides course information to facilitate student transfer within Arkansas public colleges and universities. The ACTS database contains faculty-generated comparable course information for courses offered at public institutions in Arkansas. Comparable courses within ACTS are guaranteed to transfer for full credit to any Arkansas public institution.

• 33 UA Grantham courses were assessed as part of this work.

2+2 Agreements with UA System Community Colleges

UA Grantham collaborated with University of Arkansas System community colleges to enable associate degree graduates of these colleges to continue their education and earn a bachelor degree from UA Grantham.

- **UA Hope-Texarkana** graduates from the Funeral Services, Information Technology, and Business Administration associate degree programs can enroll in UA Grantham's bachelor degrees in Multidisciplinary Studies, Information Systems, and Business Administration, respectively.
- **UA Community College at Batesville** graduates from the Business, Computer Technology, and Criminal Justice associate degree programs can enroll in UA Grantham's bachelor degrees in Business Administration, Information Systems or Computer Science, and Criminal Justice, respectively.

University of Arkansas System Employee Tuition Discount

In accordance with University of Arkansas System Board of Trustees policy, UA Grantham extends a tuition discount of 50% to qualified UA System employees enrolling in UA Grantham undergraduate programs. In addition, spouses and dependents are eligible for a 40% discount for undergraduate programs.

• In 2024, 18 UA Grantham students were identified as UA System employees.

Arkansas Rural Health Partnership

Arkansas Rural Health Partnership (ARHP) is a non-profit hospital and economic development organization composed of fourteen independently owned south Arkansas rural hospitals.

ARHP is a recipient of a government grant provided to support training and development of healthcare professionals in southeast Arkansas. ARHP partnered with UA Grantham in 2023 to offer residents of the south Arkansas delta tuition-free admission to UA Grantham fully online certificate, associate, and bachelor degree programs in Health Information Management, Healthcare Administration, and Medical Coding and Billing.

In total, **80** Arkansas residents have enrolled in UA Grantham as part of this program, distributed as follows:

- Associate in Healthcare Administration: **20 students**
- Associate in Medical Administrative Assistant: **3 students**
- Associate in Medical Coding and Billing: **24 students**
- Associate of Arts in Business Management: 1 student
- Bachelor of Science in Health Information Management: **7 students**
- Certificate in Electronic Health Records: 3 students
- Certificate in Medical Administrative Assistant: 1 student
- Certificate in Medical Coding and Billing: 21 students
 - 20 students have already graduated.



UA Grantham Students are in 70 of 75 Arkansas Counties

Since joining the UA System, Arkansas became our top state for student enrollments.

Analysis of available addresses for all students active in a UA Grantham class in 2024 shows that:

- Arkansas is the top enrolling state, with **764** active students in 2024, amounting to **14%** of all students.
- UA Grantham students are in 70 of the total 75 counties in Arkansas.



Supporting Degree Completion

According to National Student Clearinghouse research¹, the population of U.S. adults under age 65 with some college but no credential was 36.8 million in July 2022; these adult learners continue to attempt going back to school, with nearly one million re-enrolling during the 2022-23 academic year (the last year for which data was available).

UA Grantham has long supported this "Some College, No Credential" (SCNC) audience; in fact, a substantial portion of our students come to us with credits earned in other institutions.

- Transfer credits: **25%** of newly enrolled students received credit for academic coursework in other institutions
- Average number of credits transferred: 44



Bachelors Programs

Certificate Programs

For students seeking specialized knowledge in a shorter time frame, the college offers certificates in **Medical Coding and Billing** and **Medical Administrative Assistant**, ideal for gaining focused skills in these high-demand areas.

Associate Programs

Associate degree programs include **Healthcare Administration**, **Medical Administrative Assistant**, and the highly popular **Medical Coding and Billing** program, each designed to equip students with essential skills and knowledge for specialized entry-level roles.

Bachelors Programs

Associate Programs

Bachelors Programs

For students pursuing a bachelor degree, the college offers the programs in **Criminal Justice**, **Multidisciplinary Studies**, and **Strategic Communications**. These programs develop expertise in fields that require strong critical thinking, communication, and problem-solving skills, preparing graduates for a wide range of roles.

Masters Programs

The **Masters in Leadership** program is highly valued by professionals from military, government, and business backgrounds alike. This program is designed to equip leaders with advanced knowledge in organizational dynamics, decision-making, and strategic planning – essential skills for those who aim to lead and inspire in complex, high-stakes environments.

College of Science, Engineering, and Technology

The College of Science, Engineering, and Technology traces its origin to the founding of the university as the Grantham Radio License School in 1951; since then, the college stayed true to its mission of providing hands-on programs that empower students seeking technology education and making them accessible.

72% of the college's students are male. The implied 2.6 to 1 male to female ratio is better than the national male to female STEM ratio which is ~4:1, according to phys.org.

Associate Programs

The college's programs emphasize practical skills that go beyond theory, equipping students for real-world success. At the associate level, it offers degrees in **Computer Science**, **Electronics and Computer Engineering Technology**, and **Engineering Management Technology** — foundational programs designed to introduce our students to these high-demand fields.

Bachelors Programs

The college's flagship program is the ABET-accredited **Bachelor of Science in Electronics Engineering Technology**, a rigorous program recognized for meeting the highest standards in engineering technology education. Other bachelor programs include **Computer Science**, **Computer Engineering Technology**, **Cybersecurity**, **Engineering Management Technology**, and **Information Systems**, each designed to meet industry needs.

UA Grantham Teams: Academics

The Academics team is responsible for coordinating day-to-day operations of UA Grantham's four colleges, for managing and supporting faculty, and for ongoing enhancement of course content using best-in-class instructional design principles. Academics is comprised of four teams:

College Leadership The dean of the College of Science, Engineering, and Technology and the three directors of the College of Business, College of Health Professions, and College of Humanities and Social Sciences lead the development of professional and relevant program curriculum. These leaders rely on input from faculty, students, and industry experts to update content so that it reflects current industry standards and technology, in alignment with accreditation requirements and institutional goals.

Program Chairs Program Chairs actively participate in the curriculum development and assessment processes. Chairs teach, assist with accreditation, and serve as primary contacts for various departments. Chairs manage the general policies and procedures of each college, assuring compliance; they also participate in program effectiveness data gathering, analysis, and action planning.

Instructional Design and Education Technology This group maintains and improve course material within Blackboard, our Learning Management System. Team members facilitate the design process for effective quality instruction. They develop information modules for subject matter experts, faculty, staff, and students. Educational Technology Specialists support Instructional Designers as they work to assist faculty in course development.

Faculty Training and Development This team oversees recruitment, development, and evaluation of faculty members, ensuring that programs are delivered with excellence and are aligned with the university's mission and goals. Team members work closely with academic leadership, faculty, and staff to foster a collaborative and innovative teaching environment. The team also manages part-time faculty members, who do the bulk of teaching.

2024 accomplishments include

- **Instructor-student outreach (pilot)** This pilot program aims to increase instructor-student interactions in the top five 5 courses which enroll the highest number of new students and have a low student success rate.
 - Realized a 20% improvement in student success rate; program is being expanded.
- Open Educational Resources (OER) transition OER materials are either in the public domain or licensed to allow anyone to use, reuse, revise, remix, and redistribute them.
 - This project aims to achieve two goals: reduce costs and ensure that academic content is current.
 - Through the end of the year 251 out of 420 courses were migrated (60%).
- Quality Completed more than 11,000 course checks to improve instructor presence and ensure a positive student experience.
- **Program improvements** Health Professions program improvements included sunsetting of NHA certification, mapping courses to learning outcomes and accreditation requirements, and benchmarking to peer programs to ensure program competitiveness.

UA Grantham Teams: Student Experience

The Student Experience team is responsible for supporting students from first inquiry through initial enrollment and all the way to graduation. This work encompasses managing the admissions, enrollment, first-term student onboarding, and retention processes.

Admissions The Admissions team helps prospective students determine whether online education is a good fit, and which UA Grantham program fits their educational goals. Admissions members help students complete their application, collect documents for admissibility, and motivate them to complete UAG Engage, the new student orientation course. Combining self-paced activities and instructor-led sections, UAG Engage prepares new students for the online classroom, introduces databases and resources, and sets substantial academic interaction expectations.

Student Advising Following successful completion of UAG Engage, student support transitions to the Student Advising team, which is responsible for assisting students from the time they complete UAG Engage to graduation. Members of the Advising team assist students with a variety of issues including course navigation, degree planning, time management, motivation, step-out and re-entry, and satisfactory academic progress.

Student Services The Student Services team is responsible for UAG Engage, tutor.com online tutoring, the learning center, accommodations, code of conduct and plagiarism workshops, and career services.

Training and Operations The Training and Operations team is responsible for new hire training, ongoing training, knowledge base resources, and ultimately making sure that systems and processes are efficient and effective.

2024 accomplishments include:

- Zoom contact center implementation At the beginning of 2024 Student Experience partnered with the IT team to implement a new phone system. This project required a full rebuild of the phone tree, and changing phone number to include an Arkansas area code. The transition to Zoom yielded \$700k in annual cost savings.
- **UAG Engage streamlining** The Student Services team collected user experience feedback for UAG Engage, and implemented a series of improvements which resulted in a significant uptick in the number of new students completing the course. In the 2024 Anthology Together Conference, UAG Engage received the Exemplary Course Award, which recognizes instructors and course designers whose courses demonstrate best practices in four major areas: Course Design, Interaction and Collaboration, Assessment, and Learner Support.
- Cohort alignment UA Grantham terms start every month, and last eight weeks. Thus, at the beginning of every month, just as students enrolled in the prior month required additional support, their Advisors had to also support the next batch of students. Early in 2024, all students were reassigned to Advisors based on whether the student is a member of an odd cohort (started in January, March, May, and so on) or an even cohort (started in February, April, June, and so on). With this change, all students supported by any Advisor are starting classes at the same time, are in the same week of their term, and are ready to start a new term at the same time allowing the advisors to more effectively ensure student persistence.

UA Grantham Teams: Enrollment Services

Enrollment Services is comprised of four groups: Registrar, Student Financial Services, Compliance, and Institutional Research.

Registrar's Office The Registrar's office is responsible for general maintenance of records in the Student Information System (SIS). The team supports students, staff, and faculty in the admission cycle; status progression; grade submission; course scheduling; degree progress audit; clearinghouse enrollment reporting; degree checkout; and various student requests such as transcripts and verifications.

Student Financial Services The Financial Aid and Student Accounts teams work with students and staff to support all financial aspects, and to administer the awarding of Title IV aid; Veterans Administration education benefits; and military Tuition Assistance funds. The group helps students through various processes (including verification, troubleshooting FAFSA, etc.). It also assists students with payments, refunds, and calculations of Return of Title IV Funds (R2T4).

Compliance The Compliance team is responsible for the oversight of various processes related to accreditation, federal and state guidelines, and UA Board and System policies. The team also serves as the representative for Arkansas State Authorization Network (SAN) for the UA System.

Institutional Research This team is responsible for the external (IPEDS, State of Arkansas, ADHE, etc.) and internal (UA Grantham and UA System Office) reporting. It is responsible for providing clear, consistent, and accurate information and analysis through various formats including general spreadsheets, PowerBI visualization and dashboard creation, written analysis, data validation input, relational database table manipulation, and more.

2024 accomplishments include:

- Long-term SIS improvement UA Grantham retired Banner, its legacy Student Information System, in March of 2023, and transitioned to using Anthology Student. In 2024 the team continued to expand use of the new SIS. Notably, the launching of new workflows enabled transition from manual to automated processing of student status changes for applicants and students.
- 2+2 partnerships These agreements with community colleges in the UA System facilitate the admission of students who have earned a two-year associate degree into UA Grantham bachelors programs. Two agreements have already been signed, one is about to be signed, and three are in development.
- Arkansas Department of Higher Education Initiated and completed participation in ADHE's Arkansas Course Transfer System (ACTS) program, which allows students enrolled in public colleges and universities in Arkansas schools to easily receive credits for certain courses between schools. 33 UA Grantham courses were assessed as part of this work.
- **Sophia Learning** Partnered with Sophia to match ACE-recommended credit for most courses offered by Sophia. This partnership provides pathway for Sophia learners to receive credits for Sophia courses when enrolling into UA Grantham degree programs.

UA Grantham Teams: Information Technology

The IT team is responsible for delivering and supporting the digital infrastructure that enables remote learning, including the university's centralized technology infrastructure and applications, and a variety of solutions directly managed by other UA Grantham teams. IT is organized into three teams:

Service Desk The Service Desk team handles employee onboarding and separation, software license management and installation, workstation provisioning, and initial technical support for all centralized IT services. The team also provides an additional level of support for student technical issues that cannot be resolved by other student support personnel.

Technology Services The Technology Services team is responsible for legacy physical datacenter infrastructure and cloud-based virtual infrastructure services that underlie user-facing services. The team also manages technical services such as email, single sign-on, file sharing, workstation deployment, and cybersecurity monitoring.

Information Systems The Information Systems team manages the online course system, legacy database archives, and data reporting tools. The team also develops and maintains data integration software that ties together critical systems used for admissions, financial aid, student records, student outreach, human resources, finance, and user authentication.

2024 accomplishments include:

- **Telephony** The legacy telephone system was retired as part of the multi-year project of migrating from on-premises technology to modern cloud solutions that offer lower cost and better reliability.
 - The transition to Zoom Contact Center and Zoom Phone yielded \$700k in annual cost savings.
- Going to the cloud The second of three datacenters, which was based in the Lenexa, KS, location, was shut down.
 - Cost savings: \$140k annually.
 - Completed planning, testing, and preparation for shutting down third and last physical datacenter site, expected in early 2025, with projected savings of \$300k annually.
- Classroom support Migrated students from third-party web hosting service to Microsoft Azure for web development classes.
 - Cost savings of \$2,400 annually; new service already included in annual Microsoft subscription.
 - In collaboration with Academics and Instructional Design, this project also teaches students to use state-of-the-art cloud technology.

UA Grantham Teams: Finance

The Finance team is responsible for maintaining the university's financial integrity. The group is responsible for finance operations, accounts payable, and tax reporting.

Finance Operations The team ensures accurate recording of all financial transactions, completes internal and external financial reporting, and analyzes financial data and trends. The team also partners with university leaders to develop the annual budget and monitor budget variances.

Accounts Payable The team manages the procurement process in compliance with state regulations and ensures timely payment of university obligations.

Tax Reporting The team ensures all taxes are filed and paid in compliance with federal, state, and local regulations, including all payroll related taxes in partnership with HR.

2023-2024 accomplishments include:

- **Payroll implementation**: Worked with the HR department on the implementation of the new HR Information System as well as the ongoing payroll tax processing for over 100 tax jurisdictions across the 44 states and 67 localities where our employees work.
- **PaymentWorks implementation**: Continued work with the UA System office on implementation of the system-wide business identity platform that allows for supplier onboarding in a secure networked environment.

UA Grantham Teams: Marketing

The Marketing team is responsible for branding, communication, and leveraging the university's advertising budget to generate prospective student interest in UA Grantham programs. Activities managed by the team span the entire student lifecycle: from first impressions on social media or the university's website, through using communications to support the enrollment process, to maintaining current student engagement and developing the alumni community.

Creative Services The Creative Services team is responsible for communications, social media, content development, and graphic design.

Marketing Operations The Marketing Operations team is responsible for managing advertising on Google and Facebook, and for maintenance and development of web properties.

2024 accomplishments include:

- New phone-optimized landing pages delivered a significant increase in prospective student inquiry.
- Increased activity in social media yielded lower cost per lead and higher engagement.
- Increased the use of student and graduate testimonials across social media, website, marketing material, and university communications.
- **Greater focus on SEO** yielding an increase in clicks from search.
- Maturation of the new CRM system Element451:
 - Transitioned from manual processing of email communication to fully-automated prospective students nurturing via email and text messaging.
 - Deployed new workflows that significantly reduced the number of steps required to send communications.
 - Connected spend data to prospective student progression through the enrollment process, which enhanced ability to optimize return on marketing spend.

UA Grantham Teams: Human Resources

The HR team is responsible for all HR functions including talent acquisition and development, payroll, benefits, and Title IX coordination. The team is comprised of two specialists, a senior administrator, a Director of HR and the Vice Chancellor of HR, who oversees HR management and operations.

HR Management and Operations Encompasses compensation and benefit program design, leave processes, HRIS technology, and workforce analytics required to support the university stakeholders' needs. The function also manages employee relations and coaches UA Grantham managers to effectively lead their teams, align staff performance with university goals, and ensure a productive and engaged workforce.

Talent Acquisition Partners with university leaders to forecast hiring needs, conduct full life cycle recruiting, and build relationships internally and externally, creating a positive hiring experience for all candidates

Payroll Manages end-to-end payroll administration for multi-state workforce in compliance with university policy and federal, state, and local regulations.

Title IX Acts as Title IX Coordinator ensuring compliance with federal regulations related to discrimination, harassment, and equity.


2023-2024 accomplishments include:

- Transition of UA Grantham employees from leased employees to Arkansas state employees When UA Grantham was established, as a temporary measure, university employees were transferred to a professional employer organization (PEO) and leased back to the UA System. In 2023, HR began transitioning employees from the PEO. This involved reclassification of all employees to state titles and approved positions, updating legal documents, configuring the Workday HRIS system to align with the 100% remote workforce needs, and aligning policies and handbooks with UA Systems policies and procedures. HR partnered with the UA Systems Benefits and Risk Management Office, General Counsel, the Office of Finance, and University Relations to ensure all legal and compliance issues were identified and resolved in accordance with state regulations.
 - In total, this project involved transferring 149 full-time staff and 240 part-time faculty as new hires, including multi state onboarding, open enrollment, and payroll and benefits.
- Creation of an in-house, multi-state payroll department In the UA System, each campus administers payroll, including filing withholding, unemployment, and other required reports for its employees. As a fully remote workplace, UA Grantham has employees in 44 states and 67 localities, which comprise two federal, 88 state, and 67 local tax and withholding registrations, and 14 state program registrations. This created a need to design and implement a system that could manage payroll for 365 employees living across the US and employed by the State of Arkansas.
 - The project included registering by state for income tax withholding, unemployment insurance, and specific state tax requirements; filing quarterly and annual tax returns; generating year-end tax filings and W-2 forms and reporting; and staying up to date with changes in tax rates, wage laws, benefits requirements, and other regulation across multiple jurisdictions. (Streamlining payroll operations in-house ensures timely and accurate payments to employees and state jurisdictions, and mitigates legal risks by adhering to various tax and labor laws by state.)




• 80% of UA Grantham students are 25 or older:



• Student age distribution differs by degree level:




• Male / female distribution by college:
